## Foreword

Ruah Community Services has made a commitment to increase its responsiveness to the Aboriginal people and communities of Perth. Ruah has an ongoing strategic framework that incorporates a reconciliation statement and plan, and practice standards as a guide for the organisation, program delivery and workers. Ruah views reconciliation as a long term journey for the organisation and within this seeks to understand and celebrate Aboriginal culture especially the wisdom it offers for how to relate to the land and the natural world.

Ruah's Aboriginal strategic framework is focused on ensuring a culturally competent workforce, providing Aboriginal people with access to culturally secure services and fostering an organisational culture that celebrates and promotes Aboriginal culture and its rightful place in Australian society. Ruah seeks to build an Aboriginal perspective into our organisation, increase the number of Aboriginal staff and provide effective services for Aboriginal people.

Ruah has also made a commitment to celebrating the anniversary of the Commonwealth Government's apology to the stolen generation that occurred on February 13, 2008 each year. The occasion is used as an opportunity for Ruah to reflect on what it has done over the preceding 12 months to increase its responsiveness to Aboriginal people, identify the challenges that are still before it.

#### **Closing the Gap**

BAML is able to assist clients in finding a registered GP in the Closing the Gap program. An Indigenous Outreach Worker and Care Coordinator work with the GPs to assist clients with complex chronic conditions. The Care Coordinator is able to assist clients with their referrals to specialist services. The Indigenous Outreach Worker and Care Coordinator are able to attend the appointment with the client and provide transport if needed.

#### **GP Links**

This program is based in Royal Perth Hospital and Armadale Kelmscott Memorial Hospital. Staff attend the hospital on a daily basis, visit patients and enrol them into the program. Once the client has been discharged from hospital, staff will link them to a GP for further treatment. Transport, home visits and referrals to other services are provided.

#### **LIFE**

This workshop is aimed at people with a chronic condition, carers and family members. The workshop runs for 6 weeks and participants learn how to better self-manage their conditions. Some of the topics covered in the workshops are working with your health care provider, nutrition, medication, distraction, action plans, goal setting and much more.

#### **Moorditj Koorlingah**

This program runs Kids in the Kitchen program which teaches young children what and how to cook a nutritious meal for themselves and their family.

#### **Moorditj Boodjaree Yorgers**

This program assists young pregnant mums to get to their appointments, provides health education on issues that may affect the pregnancy and offers support through home visits and follow-up care.

#### **Wangen Murduin Aboriginal Health Information Service**

The Wangen program links clients to GPs, Allied Health Services and other services to address their specific needs. The staff home visit the client to register them onto the program as well as undertake a care plan to determine what their health care needs is. Transport is provided to ensure clients are able to get to their appointments.
