About Us

Midland Women's Health Care Place Incorporated (MWHCP) provide a variety of services to support all women, 16 an above.

MWHCP low cost counselling assists with a variety of issues including relationship breakdown, domestic violence, low self-esteem, anxiety, depression, prenatal and antenatal health. Our female only counsellors are located at Midland and Ellenbrook.

At the Midland centre, we also offer:

- Well-being support groups & programs designed to empower, nurture, and inspire.
- Parental programs focused on supporting and strengthening secure parentchild relationships.
- Therapeutic and psychoeducational groups provide a comfortable and supportive environment to assist women to reach their full potential.

MWHCP are an accredited provider under the National Standards for Mental Health Services and committed to a philosophy of continuous improvement. Our counselling services are founded on the Recovery model of Mental health which is a person-centred approach that builds on the person's own life experiences and journey to create an live a meaningful life within the context of their own community.

Nardine Refuge is a communal living environment for women and children escaping family and domestic violence situations. As a child safe organisation, the refuge offers individualised case management to support individuals and families rebuild their lives. Staff are trauma informed, working with women and children from a strength based, person centred philosophy.




Number of Counselling Sessions Provided






Age Groups of Clients

Number of Clients Accommodated and Supported





Case Study

In December 2023, a 25-year-old women arrived at Nardine Refuge. The lady on a protection visa had originally arrived in Australia in 2016 from Indonesia, having no other family in Australia. She had been living in unsafe conditions, having been assaulted. She was referred to the refuge through the hospital.

Whilst staying at Nardine, staff were able to support the client through the flexible support payments providing financial support, including living necessities and, ambulance cover. Safety, support and awareness programs around FDV were provided by staff. The client engaged with counselling at MWHCP once a week, as well as a wellbeing group at refuge.

With the assistance from Nardine staff, the client was able to access housing with a community housing partner and move forward with her life.

Our programs and support services cater to women of all ages and life stages, fostering connections and building a strong sense of community. With a welcoming atmosphere and ongoing support, we create spaces where women can promote emotional, physical, and mental health and build meaningful connection within the community through a variety of activities.


